

Project Brief: Dr. William A. Molson House - McGill

Brewing up a Remarkable Renovation.

Designed by Montreal architect Robert Findley and built in 1906, Molson House served as the office and residence of Dr. William A. Molson, a direct relative of the famous brewing family of Canada. This grey limestone mansion, typical of the Edwardian era, is all that's left of the time when gracious mansions and townhouses lined part of Sherbrooke Street and McGill College Avenue. The home underwent an extensive rebuild and renovation in 1992 with only the front façade remaining intact.
